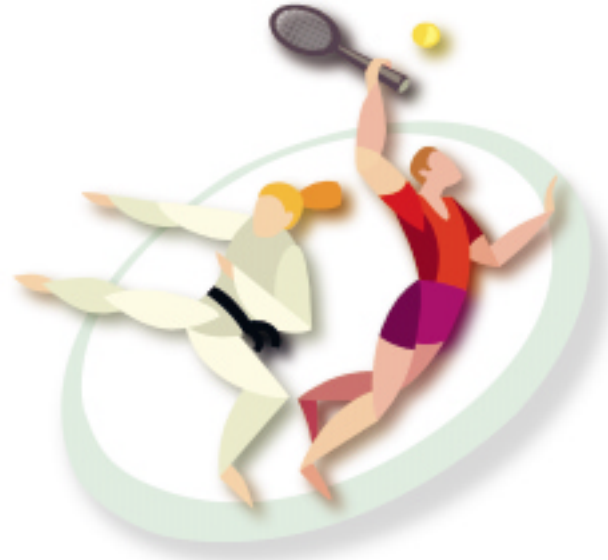


What is the process for nomination?

1. Confidential nominations will be sought twice a year from social workers and foster carers.
2. Nominations with supporting evidence will be made to the Operations Manager co-ordinating the Leisure Strategy for looked after children and considered by a panel including young people who have left care, a young person's adviser and foster carers.

The Barradell Achievement fund is the result of the vision and commitment of Rob Barradell (who served Warwickshire Social Services Dept. 1975-2000).

Rob did a sponsored cycle ride around the social services departments' offices to raise funds to reward the efforts of young people in Warwickshire's care.



What is it?

A fund set up to encourage looked after young people in Warwickshire to take part in mainstream social activity and to recognise their achievements.

The awards are made directly to the young person and will be between £50 and £100.

The award winners will also receive a framed certificate outlining their achievement.

How does a young person qualify?

The young person will be:

- Aged between 10 and 18.
- Looked after by Warwickshire Social Service Department or on a care order to Warwickshire and placed with parents.
- Able to demonstrate a long term commitment/achievement relating to a particular sport, educational or cultural activity or an activity that has clear benefits to others in the community.
