What is the Waste Development Framework all about?

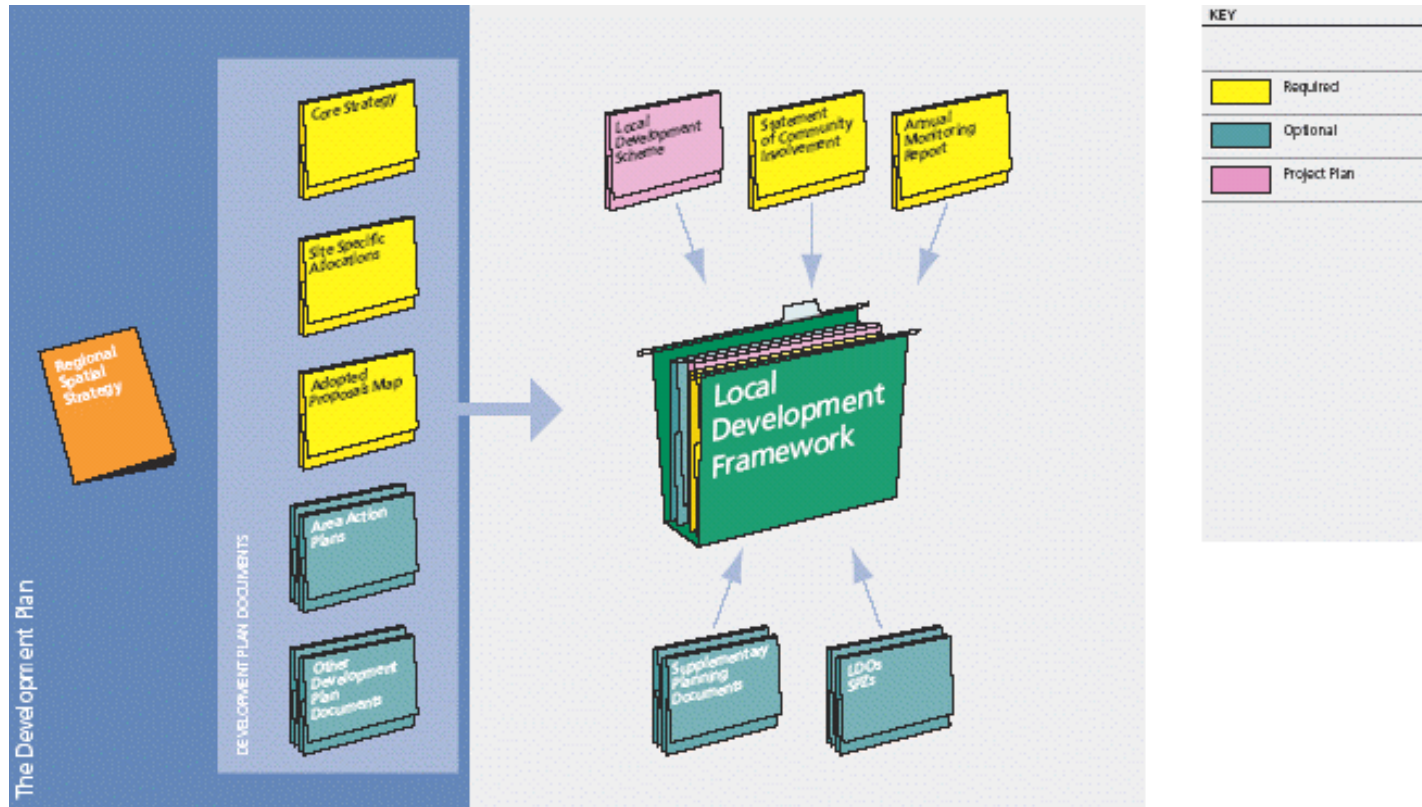
Answer:

It has to identify suitable locations for operating companies to develop appropriate sites, so that they can get rid of all the waste that households, businesses, schools, factories, hospitals and all sorts of other workers produce.

Scope of the Waste Development Framework

1. Municipal Waste (around 300,000 tonnes/year)
2. Industrial Waste (around 450,000 tonnes/year)
3. Commercial Waste (around 300,000 tonnes/year)
4. Construction & Demolition Waste (around 900,000 tonnes/year)
5. Hazardous Waste (around 60,000 tonnes/year, estimated to rise to around 70,000 tonnes/year)

2. Issues & Options Consultation (February-April 2006)
3. Preferred Options Consultation (August-October 2006)
4. Submission Consultation (January-March 2007)
