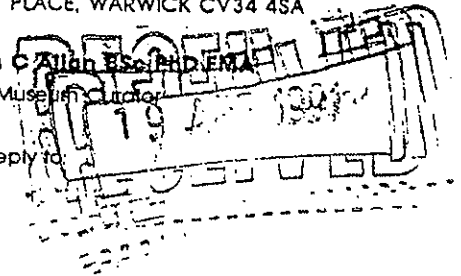

Broomhill Farm, Bourton Heath, Warwickshire

I have discussed the question of an appropriate condition to cover archaeological matters on the Broomhill Farm site with our minerals planning office. In order to achieve an approach consistent with the other conditions which they will be proposing, they would prefer the condition to refer to phases rather than areas, and propose the following:

No development shall take place within each phase until the applicant has secured the implementation of a programme of archaeological work in accordance with a written scheme of investigation for that phase which has been submitted by the applicant and approved by the Planning Authority.

I hope that this is acceptable to you and to Greenham: if further discussion is needed, I think it would be useful to involve David Marr of our Planning Department.
