# Waste Management Location Options

## Option A

Policy developed to focus new waste management facilities within predominantly urban locations.

# Waste Management Location Options

## Option B

Policy developed to focus new waste management facilities within predominantly rural locations.

# Scale of Waste Management Facilities

## Option A

Policy focused on large, centralised facilities supported by sub-regional dispersed facilities dealing with all waste types in accordance with the “proximity principle”.

# Scale of Waste Management Facilities

## Option B

Policy focused on smaller, dispersed facilities delivered in accordance with the requirements of the “proximity principle”.

# Utilisation of Existing Sites and Novel Sites

## Option A

Policy focused on extending existing waste management facilities.

# Utilisation of Existing Sites and Novel Sites

## Option B

Policy focussed on encouraging the development of new sites.

# Protection of Environmental Resources

## Option A

Policy that includes the specific protection measures for sites afforded statutory protection at a national, regional or local level.

# Protection of Environmental Resources

## Option B

Deliver policy that seeks to provide protection for sites of local significance as well as statutorily protected sites.

# Transport Infrastructure

## Option A

Deliver policy aimed at minimising traffic impacts through siting waste management facilities in proximity to the source of the waste.

# Transport Infrastructure

## Option B

Set out specific requirements on a sustainable mix of transport strategies to be incorporated within site selection (allocation) policies but no restriction on siting waste management facilities in proximity to the source of the waste.

# Site Decommissioning and Restoration

## Option A

Policy to deliver a strategic approach to restoration in adherence to core principles for the protection of natural, semi-natural and the built environments.

# Site Decommissioning and Restoration

## Option B

Policy aimed at delivering specific site decommissioning and restoration practices linked to the waste treatment and/or disposal facility type.

# Sustainability Appraisal

- Statutory Requirement;
- Short-term, Medium Term and Long-term;
- Provides for the Systematic Identification and Evaluation of :-
  - Economic;
  - Social; and
  - Environmental Impacts.

# Sustainability Appraisal Objectives

- 14 Objectives;
  - Includes;
    - Biodiversity;
    - Protection of Water Resources;
    - Minimise the Impact on Community Health etc;
- Strong Positive to Strong Negative; and
- Impact not Quantifiable;
