Answer:

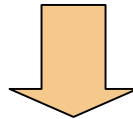

Scope of the Waste Development Framework

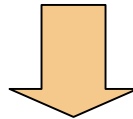
- Municipal waste (aka Household waste)

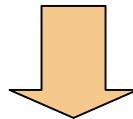

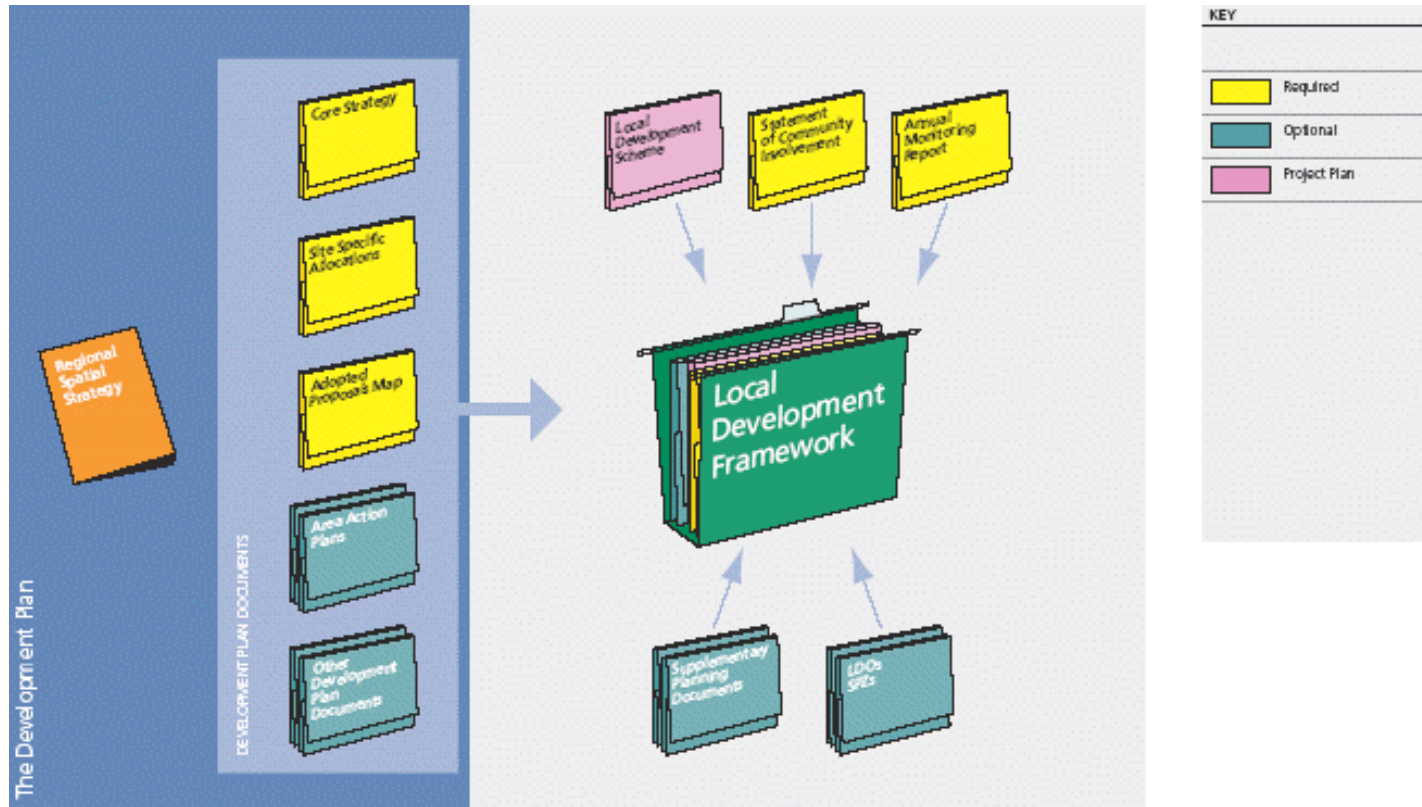

1. Preliminary Consultation (June-August 2005)
2. Issues & Options Consultation (February-April 2006)
3. Preferred Options Consultation (August-October 2006)
4. Submission Consultation (January-March 2007)
