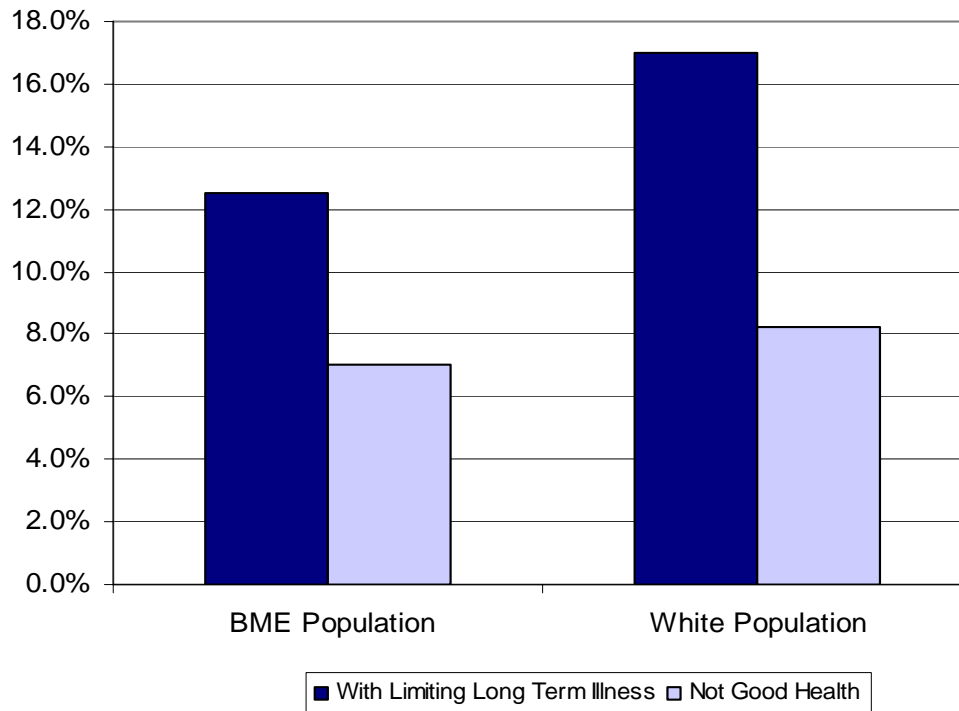

- A lower proportion of the BME population (12.5%) have a Limiting Long term Illness (LLI) compared to the overall white population (17%).
- Only 7% of the total BME population are of not good health, compared to 8.2% of the white population.
- Nuneaton & Bedworth borough has the highest proportion of the BME population with a LLI (14.9%) and those who regard their health as not good (8.3%), whilst Stratford-on-Avon has the lowest proportion (7.4% and 3.4% respectively).
