SOCIO-DEMOGRAPHIC RESEARCH & THE CENSUS

The Observatory undertakes research into the demographic and social makeup of Warwickshire. Demographic and social research includes population/household estimates and projections, information on births, deaths and migration, investigating deprivation & disadvantage, health and lifestyles.

The Observatory has conducted an extensive research programme in support of analysis and dissemination of the results of the 2001 Census. A range of Census products are available from the Observatory's website, including Area Profiles, Theme reports and a Census Atlas.

The Observatory aims to provide information and intelligence that:

RESEARCH SERVICES & CAPABILITIES

We undertake work for, and in partnership with, a wide range of customers across the County Council and other partner organisations.

The Observatory offers an extensive range of specialist research advice and services.

Analysis of information – data and information on the population, economy and other aspects of Warwickshire can be analysed and reported to meet individual requirements.

Commissioning research – we are able to provide support and advice to organisations wishing to commission research.

Consultation & focus groups – we can provide advice and support for organisations and individuals wishing to carry out consultation, including all aspects of survey work and the use of focus groups.

Forecasting and projections – for population, households, labour market etc.

Mapping and GIS – specialist software can be used to reference data geographically and produce thematic maps.

Needs Analysis – research is crucial to the process of assessing need; the Observatory can assist with evaluating the needs of service users and client groups.

Population estimates – we have access to the most up-to-date population figures and can produce small area population estimates.

Policy monitoring & evaluation – assistance with target setting, and performance evaluation.

Presentations – on all aspects of our work.

Support for funding bids – we have considerable experience in providing tailored information and intelligence in support of funding bids.

Survey design and analysis – advice and assistance is available on sampling, questionnaire design, analysis of data and other aspects of survey work, including the use of specialist survey software for the design of surveys and data capture.
