

# IMPORTANT TREE COLLECTIONS IN WARWICKSHIRE, COVENTRY AND SOLIHULL

## Introduction

The trees of the agricultural landscapes of our area tend to be fairly predictable – oak, ash, various poplars and a relatively small number of conifer species. But much more interesting collections can occur with municipal parks, the grounds of stately homes, large private gardens, college campuses, cemeteries and larger churchyards, along certain suburban roads and in certain woods.

Part 1 lists the most important tree sites that Warwickshire Museum currently knows of and highlights those for which provisional species lists occur. Part 2 gives some provisional species lists for selective sites. There are likely to be further important sites we have not yet discovered, and it is unlikely that any of the existing species lists are 100% complete or accurate. It can take several visits and an awful lot of critical checking to produce a fully accurate and comprehensive tree list for a better site. But if you think you have discovered a good tree collection that is not on the list, or would like to help refine the draft lists currently available, please contact Warwickshire Museum.
