

## Place Survey – National Indicator Draft Scores

### Introduction

The information presented in this briefing note summarises the National Indicator Scores collated from the Place Survey for Warwickshire. The questionnaire collects data for 18 of the National Indicators, including satisfaction with the area as a place to live, voluntary work, anti-social behaviour and health. At this time we only have access to the results of the questions that relate to National Indicators.

**The results are an amalgamation of the survey results from the five Borough / Districts within the County. The scores have been weighted and audited by the Audit Commission.**

The survey was carried out during Autumn 2008, the results are based on 8,164 completed replies to the survey from the five Borough / District level surveys. Generally, the results at a County level have a 95% confidence interval of approximately 1%, whilst results at a District level have a 95% confidence interval of 2 – 3%.

### Next steps

The Warwickshire Observatory will be collating the complete set of results from the Borough and District surveys over the next couple of weeks, as they become available.

The Audit Commission have said that they will publish a benchmarking report for all Councils by the middle of March. These results will be incorporated into a report highlighting the key findings from the whole survey, to be produced by the Warwickshire Observatory, this report will provide District level analysis.

Further analysis will then follow focussing on breaking the results down to a Locality level, and identifying trends over time where comparable data is available.
