How is the Council organised?

Warwickshire is a two-tier County with District and Borough, Town and Parish Councils all playing their role alongside the County Council in meeting the needs of the residents, businesses and visitors of the County. Warwickshire County Council is the largest employer in Warwickshire and is split into Directorates and Service areas that are focused on delivering excellent value for money.

The Council is made up of 62 Members, with a composition of; 39 Conservative, 12 Liberal Democrat, 10 Labour and 1 Independent, with a Conservative Administration forming the single party Member Cabinet.
